Founded in 2008 and headquartered in Beijing, the Center for China and Globalization (CCG) is China's leading global non-governmental think tank with more than ten branches and overseas representatives. At present, CCG has over 100 full-time researchers and personnel that are committed to research in the fields of globalization, global governance, international relations, talent internationalization and enterprise internationalization.

CCG is a member of the "Belt and Road" Think Tank Alliance, a founding member of the American Research Think Tank Alliance established by the Ministry of Finance, a National Talent Research Facility, the site of the China International Professional Committee for Talents of the Ministry of Human Resources and Social Affairs, a national Postdoctoral Programme research center and holds United Nations "Special Consultative Status".

After over a decade of development, CCG has become an influential think tank in the promotion of globalization in China. The authoritative *Global Go To Think Tank Index Report* released by the University of Pennsylvania has consecutively ranked CCG in the top 100 global think tanks, reaching 94 in 2018 and named CCG the leading non-governmental Chinese think tank. Many reputable domestic and international rankings regularly name CCG as the top non-governmental think tank in China.

Chair's Message

The past year has made people truly feel that we are entering a century of unprecedented change. The international order, global governance, regional security and relations among major powers have all undergone profound readjustments. The fourth industrial revolution, represented by the digital economy, has brought great opportunities, but also hidden and even triggered many new risks. The recent wave of anti-globalization and populism has cast a long shadow on the inclusive growth of the global economy.

From the perspective of the international economic and trade structures in this changing era, at least three areas that have seen significant adjustment deserve our attention:

Firstly, trends in bilateral trade relations, represented by Sino-US economic and trade relations. Throughout 2018, Sino-US economic and trade relations experienced many rounds of trade frictions. Although the negotiations between the two sides began at the end of 2018 and have made optimistic progress, we should also be aware that problems in Sino-US economic and trade relations will not be solved overnight, and require continuous exchanges and communication between both sides.

Secondly, global economic and trade governance systems, represented by WTO reform, are being severely impacted. How to reform the WTO in response to global trade trends requires the wisdom of all parties to ensure this system remains effective and the result of global consensus.

Thirdly, the development of regional trade agreements, represented by CPTPP. Regional trade agreements have played a key role in increasing levels of regional free trade, and have achieved vast growth in recent years. However, too many trade agreements can also result in the "spaghetti bowl" phenomenon.

How to promote and encourage the coordinated development of regional trade systems and the global multilateral trade system necessitates concerted consideration.

In the face of these complex problems, the international community and governments are in urgent need of solutions. This means that think tanks specializing in public policy research and policy advocacy play an important role and have the opportunity to make a difference. In the context of China's deep integration into the world economy, how China participates in global governance will garner increasing global attention and have greater significance.

Therefore, as more international changes occur, the greater the need for Chinese think tanks to actively voice and contribute wisdom. In the past year, CCG has carried out indepth research on and actively engaged in Sino-US economic and trade relations, WTO reform, and promoting China's accession to CPTPP, which has drawn considerable attention both at home and abroad.

At the beginning of 2019, CCG held its first event at the World Economic Forum in Davos, where the forum theme was "Globalization 4.0: Shaping a New Architecture in the Age of the Fourth Industrial Revolution". Pursuing its focus and research on globalization, I believe that CCG is committed and able to gather global wisdom to aide China's participation in globalization 4.0 and provide Chinese solutions for the international community to engage with globalization 4.0.

CCG has already begun its journey into its second decade, thanks to the continued support from all council members, advisors and experts. At the same time, we hope to see more leading domestic and international figures join CCG, and together build an international Chinese think tank with truly global influence.

2018 Review

In 2018, we celebrated 40 years of China's Reform and Opening-Up and CCG's tenth anniversary. Since the seed was planted a decade ago, through hard work and dedicated support, CCG has grown into a renowned think tank, well known in China and abroad.

Over the past ten years, as China progressed through Reform and Opening-up, CCG has continuously strived to fulfill its mission to "advise government and inform the people." In 2018, CCG continued to intensively cultivate its core research areas of globalization strategy, global governance, talent internationalization and enterprise internationalization, achieving fruitful results across the board.

As a key platform in policy circles, an adviser to decision-makers and an influencer of public thought and opinion, CCG has closely followed the changing events of the past year. We have produced academic analysis, research reports and policy recommendations at critical junctures on the most pressing international issues.

This year saw CCG and Social Sciences Academic Press jointly publish blue books titled *The Globalization of Chinese Enterprises 2018* and *Report on Global Migration 2018*, as well as reports including *Report on Development of World Overseas Chinese Entrepreneurs 2018*, *National Immigration Administration*, *The Three Years: recalling the classes of 77, 78 and 79, The Rising Tide: 40 years of Chinese Enterprises Going Global* and *What's Next for Globalization? Great Changes and China's Proposed Approaches*. These publications and reports showcase CCG's efforts to push forward debate and deliver high-quality research in our core areas.

As trade tensions between China and the US escalated, CCG made concerted efforts to shine light on this crucial relationship and related issues. We worked to promote mutual understanding and trust between China and the United States, releasing a series of reports: *10 Suggestions to Ease Sino-US Trade Tensions; Understanding the Sino-US Trade War: Analyses and CCG Recommendations;* and *Sino-US Trade Relations and Challenges: Past, Present, Future and Policy Options*. Our research also focused on the development, changes, employment and entrepreneurship of the new post-90s generation of returnees, detailed in our *Report on Employment & Entrepreneurship of Chinese Returnees 2018*. In the field of talent development, in order to provide a better understanding of human resources development in China, modes of development and its shortcomings, CCG published *Key countries in Global Talent 2018 Report - Human Resource Competitiveness Index*. CCG also published the first systematic analysis on personnel employment and recruitment in the Greater Bay Area, titled *Report on the Talent Development in Guangdong – Hongkong – Macao Great Bay Area*.

On April 2nd, 2018, **the National Immigration Administration** was established, after CCG had advocated the creation of a government body dedicated to immigration for over ten years. This was a major achievement and well illustrates the contribution of think tanks to key national policies. This new institution will further the development of China's immigration and talent development systems, as well as helping China to better connect with global migration governance mechanisms.

CCG visited the US in May and September of last year, cultivating Track II diplomacy channels and meeting with representatives from U.S. think tanks, Congress, and business circles. In particular, CCG interacted with the Hudson Institute, one of the most influential US conservative think tanks. Along with the Hudson Institute, CCG also issued a joint report on China-U.S. economic and trade relations in Washington, aiming at enhancing Sino-U.S. consensus, reducing frictions and avoiding misjudgments. This year, CCG welcomed a wide range of international guests, including a former US Deputy Secretary of State, US trade representatives, UN representatives, former diplomats and diplomats from the New Zealand, UK, Japanese and German embassies. CCG's diverse international engagement was further enriched by visits from the Belt and Road think tank group, visiting scholars, ambassadors, world-leading think-tank experts and international organizations. This broad engagement has made CCG a hub for international exchange in Beijing.

In August 2018, the United Nations Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC) formally granted CCG "Special Consultative Status" as a non-governmental organization to the UN's ECOSOC. CCG is one of few Chinese organizations and the only non-governmental Chinese think tank to have such status. CCG also had two of its proposed initiatives elected to the Paris Peace Forum established by French President Macron, namely, establishing an International Federation of Global Talent and an international e-commerce forum, the D50 Enterprise Digital Economy Summit. Through such forums, CCG, as a representative of Chinese non-governmental think tanks, looks to actively play its role participating in global governance and global agenda-setting activities.

With the support of leaders and friends from all walks of life, CCG has become **the first Chinese nongovernmental think tank to enter the top 100 in the Global Go To Think Tank Index Report** released by Think Tank and Civil Societies Program (TTCSP) of the University of Pennsylvania. This achievement has been repeated for two consecutive years. CCG has also received a number of accolades within the Chinese think tank community too. The China State Information Center released its **Belt and Road Big Data Report 2018**, where it once again named CCG as the most influential non-governmental think tank. The Chengdu Library and Information Center of the Chinese Academy of Sciences released its 2018 Think Tank Impact Report, recognizing CCG as the most comprehensively influential nongovernmental think tank. In the China Think Tank Index's 2018 Development Report, published by Nanjing University and Guangming Daily, CCG was again named the top non- governmental think tank for the third year running, in addition to receiving the Annual Think Tank Outstanding Achievement and Best Event awards. 2018 also saw CCG become a founding member of the US Think Tank Alliance established by the Chinese Ministry of Finance.

CCG would not have been honored with the above achievements without your long-term attention and support. As CCG marks its tenth year, we will continue with the same determination to produce high-quality contributions to the study of globalization throughout the next year, and look forward to working with you in the decades to come.

CCG's president was included in the list of **"40 leading think tank figures"**, honoring 40 years of Reform and Opening-up" compiled by the China Youth Network.




CCG was announced as the "2018 Best Government Communication University or Think Tank," organized by Chinese publication The Paper.





10 years of CCG - Opening a New Global Path for Chinese Non-Governmental Think Tanks

2018 heralded the historical occasion of 40 years of China's Reform and Opening-up, this year also marked CCG's tenth anniversary. To celebrate this occasion, more than 100 representatives from government, industry, academia and research circles, as well as over 10 foreign ambassadors to China and officials of international organizations such as the United Nations attended CCG's 10th anniversary reception. This was a time to reflect on our journey so far and look ahead to our future endeavours. CCG Granted UN "Special Consultative Status"

In August 2018, the United Nations Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC) formally granted CCG "Special Consultative Status" as a non-governmental organization to the UN. CCG is one of few Chinese organizations, and **the only non-governmental Chinese think tank, to formally hold such status**.

Consultative status is at the core of formal relationships between the United Nations and societal organizations, It functions as an important way for organizations to actively participate in the United Nations and international affairs. This status with the UN's ECOSOC recognizes an organization's influential position within its community, and confirms its role at the international level. The acquisition of special consultative status marks a new step in CCG's international engagement work and responsibilites. This status will enable CCG's more effective participation in international issues, promoting exchanges and mutual learning among nations and regions. At the same time, this status indicates the active role Chinese think tanks are playing in international affairs and their in-depth participation in global governance. CCG will use this new status to enable understanding of Chinese think tanks at the international level and seek to provide a new model for Chinese think tanks to further engage in global governance and international cooperation.




Two CCG Global Governance Initiatives Selected for the Paris Peace Forum

On November 14, 2018, the 100th anniversary of the end of the First World War, French President Emmanuel Macron hosted the Paris Peace Forum. This forum saw selected representatives from around the globe present forward-thinking initiatives to progress global governance and international cooperation. CCG's proposals of **establishing an International Federation of Global Talent** and an international e-commerce forum, **the D50 Enterprise Digital Economy Summit**, were chosen from among 900 submissions and they were the only innovative global governance Initiatives from a Chinese think tank presented at the forum. These two Initiatives reflect the changing, digital aspects of global affairs and serve to open new horizons for global governance. In addition, CCG President, Wang Huiyao, was elected to the forum's Steering Committeee. As a member of the committee, he guided and participated in the work of the Paris Peace Forum and brought China's voice to global governance. The opening ceremony of the 2018 forum saw the Steering Committee Introduce the principles and purpose of the forum to world leaders, followed by a discussion with António Guterres, United Nations Secretary-General, Angela Merkel, Chancellor of Germany, Emmanuel Macron, President of France, Vladamir Putin, President of Russia and Justin Trdeau, Prime Minister of Canada on the changing landscape of global governance.




Promotion and Establishment of the National Immigration **Administration**

Following ten years of promotion and policy recommendations by CCG, the National Immigration Administration (NIA) was established in 2018. The establishment of the NIA, through the institutional reform of the State Council, is a major institutional breakthrough for China's immigration management system and talent development institutions. The success of CCG's work in this project showcases how non-governmental think tanks can participate in the reform of national institutions and impact national policy.



On April 2, 2018, the National Immigration Administration was officially established.

In May 2015, at the Geneva Headquarters of the International Organization for Migration (IOM), Wang Huiyao, President of CCG, as the only member of the IOM Immigration Advisory Committee from China, participated in internal discussions on migration challenges and longtem migration trends and global perspectives, where he exchanged CCG research results on international migration with international experts. of the Social Department of the National Development and Reform Commission (NDRC) came to CCG to request research on international talent flow trends for the establishment of the National Immigration Administration. CCG subsequently completed the research work assigned and reported its findings to the NDRC. At present, CCG is undertaking the first major research project for the National Immigration Administration since its establishment, and continuously provides consulting services to the body.



Strengthening the Management of Foreigners' Permanent Residence Services" issued by the central government commented on the need to improve China's immigration management structure, pointing out that "further improving of national immigration management agencies and the allocation of responsibilities was needed." In June 2016, CCG's "Recommendation on China's Entry into the International Organization for Migration (IOM)" was adopted by the central government. The IOM subsequently adopted a resolution approving the application of the Chinese government and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs for IOM membership.



US "Track II Diplomacy" Activity Series

2018 was a turbulent year for Sino-US relations. During this critical period for economic and trade relations, a CCG delegation made two visits to the US to carry out **"track II diplomacy"** activities. CCG's two trips saw the delegation hold exchanges with representatives of US think tanks, the State Department, the business community, and members of the Senate and House of Representatives. CCG also held a report release at the top US conservative think tank, the Hudson Institute, and participated in exchange events held at the Heritage Foundation and the American Enterprise Institute (AEI). Our series of "track II diplomacy" activities aimed at enhancing common understanding between China and the United States, reducing friction and avoiding misjudgments. They demonstrate the position and ability of Chinese think tanks to exert their role in public diplomacy.






2018 is the 40th anniversary of China's Reform and Opening-up. While China used to have a limited understanding and conservative approach to globalization, over the past four decades, China has gradually embraced the notion of globalization, becoming an active participant of the global economy and key advocate for globalization. In 2018, the trend of "de-globalization" became increasingly pervasive - unilateralism continued to spread, trade frictions intensified worldwide and the international situation faced great uncertainty. Throughout these turbulent times, the Center for China and Globalization (CCG) has continued to move forward, and dedicated itself to research on globalization, global governance, international relations, globalization of talent and internationalization of enterprises. Over the last 12 months, CCG published **14** Chinese and English research publications and released **more than 10** research reports, distributed over **10,000 copies** of CCG research and received over 270,000 online views. 

Third China Global Think Tank Innovation Forum

2018 Conference on Global Talent Mobility, Migration and Immigration Law

Throughout this year CCG has continued to promote talent and immigration research and put forward many suggestions to improve China's immigration system. This year saw CCG's efforts rewarded with the successful establishment of the National Immigration Administration (NIA). The "2018 Conference on Global Talent Mobility, Migration and Immigration Law" is the first national high-level symposium on immigration research following the establishment of the NIA. Nearly 200 professionals from various domestic ministries, international organizations and industries, universities and research institutes participated in the conference, including the NIA, Ministry of Human Resources and Social Security, Office of Overseas Chinese, International Organization for Migration, International Committee of the Red Cross, United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees, Metropolis International, and universities and research institutes. The conference was co-organized by CCG and the Law School of the Beijing University of Technology, with experts attending two plenary sessions and ten workshops to discuss issues such as global talent flow and talent attraction policy, global migration governance and social integration, and migration law among other pressing topics. At the conference, CCG announced the establishment of Immigration Research Center and launched four new books, aiming at cooperating with leading figures from the area of immigration to contribute to the field of immigration studies, provide comprehensive policy suggestions and support the development of the NIA.

CCG held this seminar and especially invited Michael Pillsbury, Director of the China Strategy Center of the Hudson Institute, and Terry Miller, Director of the Center for International Economic and Trade Research of the US Heritage Foundation. More than ten Chinese and foreign experts and scholars gathered to discuss Sino-US relations and Sino-US economic and trade at this moment and into the future, providing timely analysis and suggestions for the turbulent Sino-US relations and its future development.





Theme Sino-UK Cooperation on the "Belt and Road" Initiative Date May 28th

Preceding President Xi Jinping's meeting with UK's Prince Andrew, the Duke of York, CCG and the Asian Strategy & Leadership Institute (ASLI) held a seminar focused on the prospects of Sino-UK cooperation on the "Belt and Road" Initiative. Discussions on the UK's involvement in the initiative have been ongoing, with talks occurring between Prince Andrew, President of the World Chinese Economic Forum and CEO of ASLI, Michael Yeoh and many representatives from Malaysia, UK, China and other countries on future cooperation and the development of East Asia.

CCG and Carleton University of Canada co-hosted this international seminar in Ottawa to discuss global talent competition in the background of the rise in counter globalization and the increasing frequency of talent flows worldwide. It attracted a large number of experts and scholars from North America, Asia and Europe who participated in the lively discussion.

Experts from countries across Europe and Asia discussed integrated design development framework and cooperation indicator systems, creating connections for the globalized world and jointly developing an operational framework for future engagement.

March 15th - CCG was invited to attend the 6th Baku Global Forum on the topic of "Eliminating Differences to Create an Inclusive Society".
